So Hungary is situated in Central Europe, they even usually say that Hungary is the heart of Europe. The country occupies a territory of about 93,000 square kilometres.

We would like to start with Sports in Hungary:

The most popular Sports are wrestling, canoe/kayak, handball, football/soccer, fencing and water polo. The most popular among them is Football/Soccer, because it is the most popular among all genders and age groups.

A fun fact is that ice-hockey is one of the rarest sports to do in Hungary.

We would like to continue with the games that are popular in Hungary.

There are some of them but we have even more. So the First one is Bújócska aka Hide and seek, the second is Fogócska which is Tag, Then Ipiapacs which is like a Hide and seek with a little tag, if the seeker finds someone they have to shout they name then run the point where they counted, if the seeker gets to the they will be a hider, but if the hider gets there first they will be still as a seeker. Then there is Kacsázás where you have to throw a stone and the goal is that the stone will hop on the top of the water as long as it could. Then kidobós which is Dodgeball, then Ugróiskola which is Hopscotch, then Számháború aka War of Numbers. There is Cicázás where 3 people play, 1 person stands between 2 people with distance, then the 2 people have to pass each other the ball but they have to be careful that the 1 person who is the “cat” doesn't get the chance of touching or catching the ball. Finally Bújj Bújj Zöld ág which is a traditional Hungarian game. A group of people hold each other's hands but 2 people create a “gate” and the other people have to go under it. It even has a little song too. When they get to the end of the song a gate is closing and the pair who is under the gate will be the new gate.

So activities you can do in Hungary are to go camping, be at a festival and go see our national treasures.

You can go camping in multiple places but what is most popular is to go in the Mátra Mountains, anywhere around The Lake Balaton and actually at any holiday purpose towns.

We have multiple festivals in Hungary like Debrecen's Flower Carnival where there are flower-covered floats, flower-costumed stilt walkers, and flower-themed crafts for the kids. It's held in August. Also, Sziget Festival Over half a million music fans gather on Óbuda Sziget (Obuda Island) in Budapest every summer for one of the largest rock festivals in Europe, a lot of famous English performers and bands come to give concerts, it's held in August. Busó Walking of Mohács Originating in the 18th century, Busó Walking of Mohács is based on a legend of the ethnic Croatian Šokac people, who lived in the nearby swamps and woods to avoid Ottoman troops. They returned to the town wearing scary masks and using hand-carved weapons, driving the Ottoman troops from the town. Another legend says that the masks were used to scare away winter but, whatever the real story, the festival sees a variety of Busó (the traditional scary carved masks) groups dancing on stage and parading through the streets, along with folk dancers and tambourine bands. Folk art and masks from master carvers are on display, too, it's usually held usually before Ash Wednesday.

You can go to see our national treasures like one of the most famous national parks, Hortobágy National Park, Aggtelek National Park and Szalajka Valley. One of the Cultural attractions is Hollókő, Cák and Szalafő. And finally you can go hiking in Mátra.

You have several opportunities to go on programs in Hungary. You can go to our Capital City to see Parliament Building & Crown Jewels, Heroes' Square and the Millennium Monument, Buda Castle & Castle Hill, Fisherman's Bastion, Margaret Island and Budapest Zoo & Botanical Garden. In Mátra you can go to Oxygen Adrenalin Park, View Tower at Sástó Kékes, Kisnána's castle and in winter you have the opportunity to go to The Ski Park at Mátraszentimre. At the Lake Balaton you can see Tihany Abbey, Badacsony Sphere lookout, Hegyestű, Szentbékállá, Stone Field Tagore Promenade in Balatonfüred.
